Curios are described by Mojo as "the most formidable piano trio in the UK". With two acclaimed records behind them, touring throughout the UK and Europe and winner of **'Best Band' at the BBC Jazz Awards** in 2008, Curios are poised to be launched to a worldwide audience. Drawing on romantic classical music as much as modern jazz, Cawley's compositions are melodic, fiery, serene and intense.
